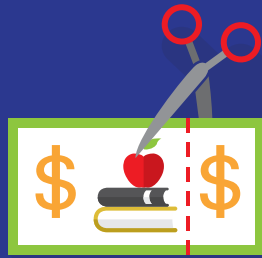


SB 302 Nevada's ESA Voucher Program



What is an ESA?

An ESA is a voucher that diverts taxpayer money constitutionally allocated for public schools to private schools and private education expenses.

ESA Vouchers benefit only a few students at the expense of many.



How Much Taxpayer Money Will be Used for ESA Vouchers?

Public schools will lose between \$5,100 or \$5,700 per pupil qualified for the ESA Vouchers, per school year. There is no limit on how much money can be diverted from public schools.

\$26,000,000+

per year would be diverted from public schools if the program went into effect today.



How Will ESA Vouchers Threaten Our Public Schools?

- ESA Vouchers take away public school resources. All students, regardless of their zip code, deserve support, tools, and time to learn.
- ESA Vouchers are unfair. There will be less funding for those who need it most, like students with disabilities and those at-risk.
- Scarce public school dollars will be diverted to private schools that can exclude special education, English language learner, and academically at-risk students. These students deserve an exceptional public education.
- ESA Voucher fraud may occur. Only 10% of ESA Voucher accounts will be audited, meaning fraud and misuse of taxpayer dollars can go unchecked.

Why Every Nevadan Should Say No to ESA Vouchers

Approximately 80% of the initial 4,100 ESA Voucher applicants come from higher income households that can use the money to reduce private school tuition and fees they can likely already afford.

Nevada's ESA Voucher Program is wrong for our school children, and the long-term effects will threaten our communities.
